Staff Spotlight Tips on Being Cyber Smart & **Protecting Your Personal Info**

The Internet touches almost all aspects of our daily lives. From shopping to banking to handling medical records - we can do it all online. Data breach costs rose to 4.24 million dollars in this last year and compromised credentials, like passwords, were responsible for 20% of these. Follow these tips when sharing personal information online to reduce the risk of becoming a victim of a cvbercrime.

Double your login protection. Enable multi-factor authentication (MFA) to ensure that you are the only person who has access to your accounts.

Shake up your password protocol. Get creative and customize your standard password for different sites.

Keep up to date. Maintain your security settings to keep your information safe by turning on automatic updates or allow your security software to run regular scans.

Play hard to get with strangers. Cyber criminals use phishing tactics to try and fool their victims. If you're unsure who an email is from, even if it appears to be legitimate, or if the email looks off, do not respond and do not click on any links or attachments found in the email. Use the "junk" or "block" functions to no longer receive messages from that sender.

Never click and tell. Keep Social Security Numbers, account numbers, and passwords private, as well as specific information about yourself, like your full name, address, birthday, and even vacation plans.

Keep tabs on your apps. Check your app permissions and use the "rule of least privelege" to delete what you don't need or no longer use. Only download apps from trusted vendors and sources.

Stay protected while connected. Before you connect to any public wireless hotspot - such as an airport, hotel, or cafe - be sure to confirm the name of the network and login procedures with staff to ensure it is legitimate. If you do use an unsecured public access point, practice safe internet skills by avoiding sensitive activities (such as banking) that require passwords or credit cards.
